Course abstract

The study course is envisaged for the students of the study programme “Law”. Students are acquainted with the main categories, concepts, and notions (politics, state, political system, power, etc.), as well as with its theoretical problems, research methods, and methodology of political science. The study course also aims at developing the students’ skills and abilities to independently analyze and discuss political topicalities.

Learning outcomes

The students develop their academic competence:

- know and appropriately use political terminology;
- demonstrate their knowledge of regularities of socio-political processes;
- are ready to draw conclusions concerning the significance of socio-political processes in the development of a political nation;
- understand and are able to explain the mutual interaction of political processes in functioning of social processes.

Students develop their skills to apply their academic competence in practical activity:

- demonstrate skills in finding and selecting information, its analysis and comparison, as well as its use in the analysis of a definite situation, argumentative discussion;
- demonstrate skills to select study materials and are aware of the basic principles of their use.

Students develop their skills to use their academic competence in value-oriented action:

- demonstrate critical understanding of the transformations in the treatment of the history of Latvia under the influence of political regimes and are able to discuss controversial issues in the history of Latvia.

During the implementation of the study course the students:

- demonstrate knowledge about politics;
- are able to independently search for information that is necessary for the analysis of a definite situation, particularly emphasizing the possibilities and the restrictions of the information analysis;
- gain knowledge of topical issues of political science and real policy;
- will be able to analytically and critically discuss the developments in international and regional policy by discussing the topicalities of contemporary politics;
- are aware of the outer and inner factors that influence countries’ foreign policy and internal politics;
- will be able to express and defend their findings by using academic and other sources; •will be able to discuss the alternatives of the development of states, poles of personalities in politics and the role of individuals in political processes.

Course plan

Lectures – 32 acad. hours.

Lecture topics:

1. Introduction of political science. Political science in the system of sciences. Object and objectives of political science. The aim, objectives and structure of the study course.
2. Theoretical issues of political sciences. The history of theories. Sources of political science. Concise socio-political and socio-economic description. Paradigms of culture.
3. The notion of politics. The object and the subject of policy. Objective and subjective borders of policy. Policy effectiveness.
4. Policy structure. Political typology. Types of forms of policies. Political tools.
5. The notion of a state. State as a political institution. The principle of the division of power and the construction of a state apparatus. State forms.
6. Ideology. Types of ideologies (conservatism, social-democratic ideology, liberalism).
7. Types of ideologies (nationalism, “ecologism”, “non-ideological” ideology). State ideology. Analysis of state ideology.
8. Political regimes and their typology. Political regimes in Poland, Belarus, Russia, Latvia and Lithuania – characteristics and comparative analysis.
9. Political system. Elements of political system. Economics and politics.
10. Power in a political system. The phenomenon of power. Political power.
11. The legitimacy of political power. The structure of power. Resources (tools) of political power.
12. Political culture. Elements of political culture. Paradigms of political culture in Latvia, Lithuania, Russia and Belarus.
13. Introduction to geopolitics. Geopolitics and real policy.
14. Global and regional organizations: EU, NATO, Commonwealth of Independent States, Shanghai Organization, etc.
15. Analysis of international relations: historical, behaviouristic, and system approach. Prospects and models of the development of Latvia.
16. Analysis of contemporary international relations. Political alternative of Eastern European development.

Requirements for awarding credit points

Participation in lectures – 30 %, graded test at the end of the semester – 70%

Course content

Power in a political system. Political culture. Geopolitics. Global and regional organizations. Analysis of international relations. Prospects and models of the development of Latvia.
