Study Course Abstract

The course is intended for the students of the bachelor programme "Philology" students. Traditional course includes questions about the classification of the parts of speech, grammatical categories, declension and conjugation types, morphology and syntax relations. The aim of the course is to introduce students to the morphological system of the modern Russian language; to characterize contemporary Russian peculiarities of parts of speech, lexical grammatical categories, their trends; to develop morphological analysis skills.

Course Plan

Course structure: Lectures - 8 h., Seminars - 8 hours.

Lecture topics:

- 1.The word meaning and its types. Grammatical categories and their types.
- 2.Word class characteristics and their distribution principles. Word class classification (Л.В.Щерба, В.В.Виноградов).
- 3.Noun. Lexical-grammatical categories of nouns.
- 4.Grammatical categories of nouns.

Seminar topics:

- 1.Noun meaning. Proper names and general nouns. Animated / non animated categories.
- 2.Grammatical categories of nouns - gender, number, case.
- 3.Nouns' case system.
- 4.Noun declension types.

Students' independent work:

- theoretical studies; •practical work.

Learning Outcomes

After the completion of the course, the students:

- Are familiar with grammatical concepts;
- Understand the morphological system of the Russian language;
- Are able to identify parts of speech and borderline cases;
- Orient in semantic and syntactic functions of parts of speech; -Manage grammatical form linguistic analysis skills.

Final assessment consists of: Home work (20%) 2 tests (40%), final examination (40%).
